Message from Mrs. Hemingway

LPA Families,

- We are so excited for the 2021-2022 school year. It was so nice to see our Wolf families at our Wolf Greeting on August 13.
- **Masks:** Parents and staff have the choice to come to school masked or unmasked. We will spend time during the first week of school reminding students to be respectful of each family's choice. We will not tolerate any negative comments regarding someone's decision to wear or not wear a mask. As a reminder, there is not a mask mandate for teachers and staff. It is not appropriate for parents to request a teacher wear a mask, nor a teacher to request that a student wear a mask. We all need to respect each other's right to choose. We cannot group students in the classroom based on who is wearing a mask, we group students based on instructional needs.
- **Vaccination status:** As a reminder, vaccines are a choice, and we cannot ask anyone if they have been vaccinated or not. This would be a violation of the Personal Health Information Protection Act.
- **School Access Form:** In a continuing effort to provide safety and security to our students and staff we ask that you complete a School Access Form if you plan to enter a facility in the St. Johns County School District. This includes if you would like to participate in field trips, book fairs, field days, parent/teacher conferences, etc. Please make sure you complete the school access form online at <http://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/volunteer/>. It is important that each member of the family (parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, etc.) complete this access form online prior to requesting access into the school. The approval process takes about 2-4 weeks to process. All classroom volunteering must have an instructional focus and be planned with the classroom teacher. Parents/Guardians are not allowed to eat lunch with their child this school year due to COVID.
- **Birthday or special treats:** Items must be dropped off at the front office for your child's K-5 classroom. Please provide enough for the whole class, check with the teacher for food allergies and a good date for the treat to be dropped off. All items must be store bought and individually wrapped items (Ex. Little Debbie items – donuts, pizza, etc. are not allowed). Items made at home will not be accepted. The classroom teacher will provide the treat at a time that does not impact student learning. Treats may not be dropped off for middle school students as they have 7 different teachers.



Student Health Screening Entry Form

Please assess your child daily for the following symptoms and answer the contact questions.

- Fever of 100.4 or higher
- Uncontrolled cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Sore throat
- Loss of sense of smell or taste
- Muscle aches
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- Is your child currently awaiting COVID-19 test results?
- Does your child live in the same household with someone positive for COVID-19? **If yes, please keep your child home and notify the school nurse when test results are received. Further instructions will be discussed at that time.**
- Has your child had close contact with someone who in the past 14 days tested positive for COVID-19? **If yes, your child must quarantine for 7 days from the last date of contact with the positive individual. The quarantine period may be shortened if a negative COVID test result is obtained on day 5 or later from exposure to the positive case.**

Club News

Math Counts

Math Counts is an afterschool club run by Mr. Ferrara that meets every Thursday. Every practice, they meet and work on math problems and compete against each other. In February, they participate in a competition, held at the University of North Florida. They compete with three counties: Duval, Clay, and St. Johns. In 2019, which was the last competition due to Covid, they came in first place. Math Counts is a good place for students who aren't into sports or are even into sports to come and do a little math and have fun. Mr. Ferrara believes that it is important for Liberty Pines to have a well-rounded curriculum that doesn't just include sports.

Math Counts teaches its students that you don't just have to think in the way that your teachers taught you, but you can also use methods to become quicker and take shortcuts to get to the right answer. Mr. Ferrara thinks that this year's team will be successful and do well. He wants to work on speed and not letting students get hung up on showing all their work.

Eighth grade student, Monica Posina participated in Math Counts last year. She said that math is her favorite subject and that she had thought it would be a fun experience for her to participate in. Her favorite game they competed in was Team Kahoot because it gave her the chance to test her skills and do it with friends. Math Counts has helped her to be familiar with many math skills and to have a great experience while learning.

Odyssey of the Mind

Odyssey of the Mind is a yearly competition that consists of trying to solve problems. There are long-term problems which are presented at the competition and include creating a skit with costumes and also solving the problem by engineering. For example, last year's team's problem was a vehicle problem, and the students were told to build a vehicle that was self-propelled, and it had to be able to smile, make a noise, and have a special effect. The engineered solution is then presented in the skit that the students perform. Students will create the backdrop, script, and costumes for the skit presentation.

There are spontaneous problems as well. In these problems, students go into it not knowing what the problem or solution might be. For example, one year the group of students was asked to name anything green. The more creative the answers they gave, the more points they scored. Mrs. Waggoner believes that Odyssey of the Mind teaches students important skills such as teamwork, self-confidence, and lots of creativity. Many kids come into this club, not knowing anything about engineering and acting but come out feeling much more confident in themselves and their capabilities.

Eighth grade student, Niki Pan, who was in this club in previous years, believes that Odyssey of the Mind was a great experience. Everyone in the club would be able to have fun together building, brainstorming, and shopping for supplies. Her favorite activities consist of making props and costumes and getting to be creative with them. She highly recommends this club for any who are interested in meeting new friends and being creative.
