## Safety Patrol

Here at Liberty Pines Academy, we have a Safety Patrol team. We have two fifth grade teachers that also run Safety Patrol, Ms. Raiford and Ms. Weitzel. Safety Patrol is offered to 5<sup>th</sup> graders; they must maintain a B average, preferably higher, in all their classes and demonstrate leadership, trustworthiness and responsibility in and out of the classroom. They should be role models for their other classmates, and the younger kids they are around every day in the hallways. They do most of the job on their own; they come to school early (if they do morning patrol), put their bags away, put their belt on, go to their post and do their assigned job. If they are in the afternoon, they leave at the first bell and go to their post to do their job. The members are on their own, no one watches them, so safety patrol teaches individuality and how to make good choices even when no one is around.

During the interview Ms. Raiford also mentioned that Safety Patrol is important because it helps put extra eyes on the school. Realistically the teachers can't be everywhere at the same time. They also hold doors open that are usually locked from the outside. These members help students get inside the building in the morning. Safety Patrol members also help the car ride move faster by opening the doors and letting students in or out, depending on the morning or afternoon. We also had the chance to interview two Safety Patrol students, Matthew C. and Piper W. Both of them mentioned how fun it was to be a safety patrol, how they would definitely recommend it to younger kids and how they love having the responsibility! 




