#### FSA Testing Dates

Florida Standards Assessments were developed to measure student success with the Florida State Standards. Please review the testing calendar under the calendar tab of our school website for specific testing dates. Please try not to schedule a doctor or dentist appointment for your child on the day of testing. Please remember that during testing days the campus is closed to all visitors. As much as we appreciate our families assisting in the classrooms, we must value a quiet and uninterrupted testing environment for all our students on each testing date. We appreciate your support with these dates and know that our students are prepared and will do well on the state assessments.

**Heritage Oaks** – Parents, we need your help. Please do not use the Heritage Oaks subdivision as a parent drop off or parent pick up location. The extra number of cars in the front of this subdivision is creating an unsafe condition for our students that walk to and from LPA. The use of Russell Sampson Road and the grass area near 9B are also not designed as student pick up or drop off areas. We ask that you use our parent pick up loop to drop your child off in the morning and to pick up your child in the afternoon. We are finished with parent pick up before 3:15 pm each day and by 2:15 pm on Wednesday. The safety of our students and our families is our top propriety. 7. Eliminate obvious incorrect answers
8. Take short breaks when stressed to calm down, then resume testing
9. Answer all questions to the best of your ability
10. Review your work if you have finished early

## Art Corner

Liberty Pines Academy's art show is coming soon! Wednesday April 27<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 to 8:00pm at LPA you can come to see the student's wonderful artwork. The art show will include 2D and 3D artwork from every elementary student and several middle school students. The show will include paintings, drawings, and clay pieces the students have made.

The show, called "Art off the Wall", is also a fundraiser. Parents can take home artwork from the show if they donate a dollar. All the earnings will go towards the art classes for more supplies.

The elementary art classes have been busy with art projects for the show. Many of them have made paintings and collages. Fourth and fifth graders have been working with clay. "Clay is hands down their favorite project," said Ms. Scoggins, the elementary art teacher.

Middle school students have also contributed to the show. From sixth grade we will see examples of Paleolithic cave art. "Students approximated the look of drawing and painting on a stone surface by crumbling up thick brown paper and drawing on the rough texture with chalk pastels. These are similar to the pigments that stone age artists might have used 40,000 years ago," said Mr. Wolfe, the middle school art teacher. Seventh and eighth graders will display paintings that convey a personal message from the individual artist, such as atmospheric perspective and color theory.

Outside of preparing for the art show, one thing Mr. Wolfe and his class always look forward to is Critique Wednesday, where they look at famous art and discuss it in class. "I am constantly amazed at some of the original insights that our students offer," he said. "It never fails, no matter how many times I may have looked at a classic painting, one of our students will chime in with an innovative and exciting point-of-view."

## CHAMPIONSHIP SPOTLIGHT






