May History Reflection

On May 26th, 1940, the evacuation of Dunkirk began. The evacuation of Dunkirk was an emergency operation that took place just after the German army in the second World War had encircled some 300,000 Allied troops. For the British and French, the situation was dire.

When the German army punched through countries like Belgium to get to France, the French military initially thought that they could hold against the encroaching Nazi menace. This was simply not the case. When the Germans got past Belgium, they immediately pushed thousands of Allied troops into a port city and cut their escape off, leaving them all stranded in the city and incapable of breaking through.

The United Kingdom immediately began a mass evacuation-but there was a large issue. There were vastly many more people than could be fit on whatever transports the British had. Because of this issue, the United Kingdom ordered every ship in the country that could hold a man be ordered to the French city of Dunkirk to evacuate as many as possible-up to 8,000 being evacuated on just the first day.

This event in history serves as a reminder that with resolve and a calm head that anything can be done, even dangerous feats such as "Operation Dynamo" (the evacuation of Dunkirk).
