The Program of Interest application is now open for rising 9th and 10th grade students who are interested in participating in high school career academies, IB, AICE, Early College, Early Career, ROTC, and SJCCA programs. Rising 6th grade students may also apply for SJCCA at Murray Middle School.

The application window for Programs of Interest will close on **January 24, 2025 at 5pm**. If a program receives more applications than there are seats available, a weighted lottery process will be used to place students.

The application can be accessed by logging into HAC with the STUDENT credentials. Click the Classes tab, and then the Requests tab.

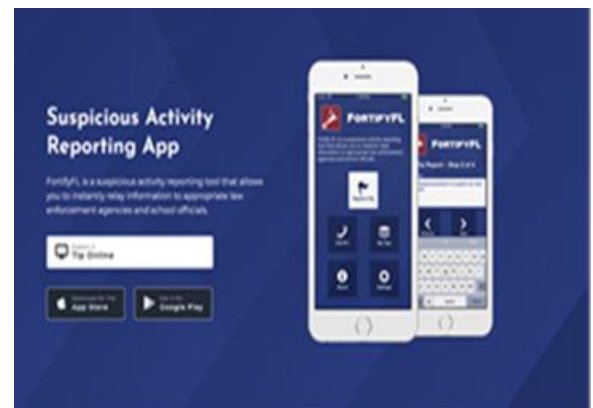

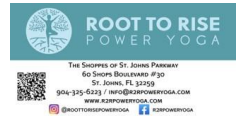
