For Valentine's Day their group got to decorate boxes and people put valentines and candy in their boxes which she thought was tons of fun! Plus, what little kid doesn't love candy?



History Reflection: National Freedom Day

The Civil War in the U.S. began in 1861 because of the tension between northern and southern states over slavery, states' rights, and westward expansion. When Abraham Lincoln was elected as President in 1860, seven southern states decided to break apart from the rest of the states and form the



National Freedom Day, February 1st, celebrates the signing of the 13th Amendment to the Constitution by Abraham Lincoln in 1865, which outlawed slavery. It declares: "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction." The 13th Amendment was passed during the Civil War and later ratified on December 6th, 1865.

Major Richard Robert Wright Sr., a former slave and highly accomplished man, believed that there should be a holiday to celebrate the newfound freedom for all Americans. He was an educator, a well-known political activist and journalist, military officer, and banking entrepreneur. Wright had an interest in commemoration. He wanted to ensure that the importance of the 13th Amendment would never be forgotten. He began to voice the idea of National Freedom Day in 1914. Wright chose February 1st because it was the date when President Abraham Lincoln signed the 13th Amendment.

In 1948, a year after he passed away, it was officially a national holiday by proclamation of President Harry S. Truman. Now, every February 1st, the day the 13th Amendment was signed in 1865, National Freedom Day is celebrated. It's an important date to look back on and understand the long and difficult battle the U.S. had for freedom. It's also an opportunity to remember the brave people who fought for their rights and appreciate the freedoms we have now.






