


# **Kindergarten Year End Activities**

**IF** you would like to purchase a **NEW** LPA PE uniform for next school year, please go to the LPA website and scroll down near the bottom of the page for the online ordering (School Pay) link. From there, you will be directed to login or create a school pay account where you will be able to purchase your child's PE uniform for the next school year. Look for "Pre order: 2025-2026 PE uniform."


